4. Conduct a Gap Analysis

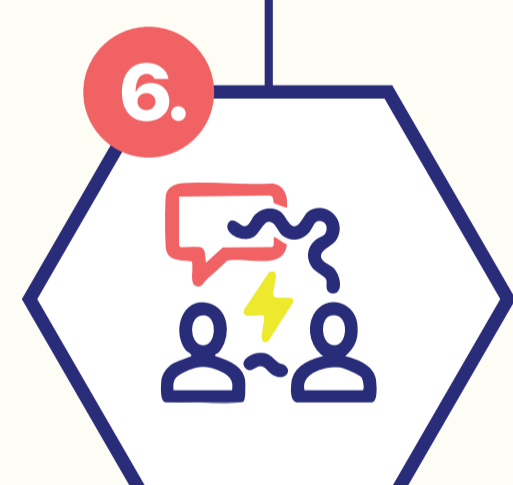

5. Build Your Ladder of Development

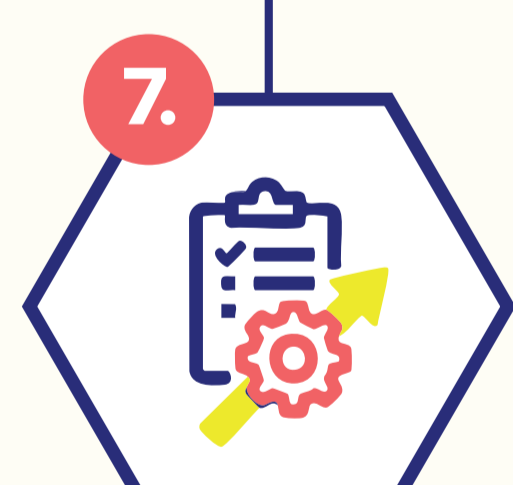

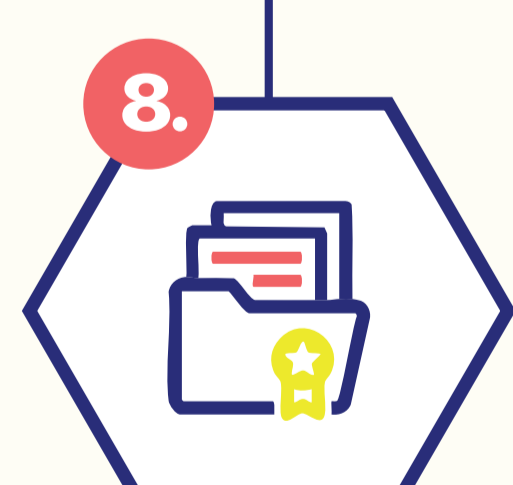
6. Master Essential Soft Skills

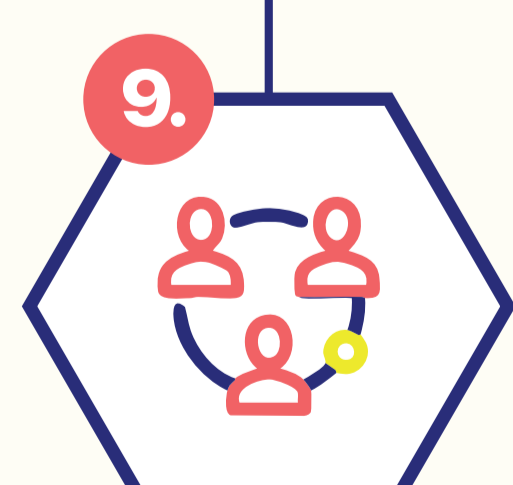
7. Gain Practical Experience
